The Saskatoon Industry-Education Council (SIEC) is excited to offer students an opportunity to experience the world of game development! During the eight-week bootcamp, you will learn the skills you need to get started with game development; students will have the opportunity to design and build their own customized computer game project.

- The GameOn! Skills Boot Camp is open to students in grades 10, 11 and 12.

Requirements

- Access to own computer (Desktop or laptop)
 - You will need approximately 11GB of storage to download game platform
 - Unity download instructions will be sent to you after application deadline
 - Must include webcam, microphone so you are able to interact with instructors and class
- Must have valid email address for program communication and sign up. (Please include on application)

After the application deadline you will be notified if you have been accepted into the program. All sessions will be facilitated by individuals from the University of Saskatchewan Computer Science Program and local computer programmers.
