The Saskatoon Industry-Education Council (SIEC) is excited to be partnering with the University of Saskatchewan Computer Science Division to offer students an opportunity to experience the world of game development! Learn how to create your own computer game using programming and design skills. Explore logic, mechanics and visuals that all go into creating a computer game from scratch.

During the eight-week bootcamp, you will learn the skills you need to get started with game development; students will have the opportunity to design and build their own customized computer game project.

This bootcamp is designed for all skill levels. If you have never programmed before, or are looking to expand on a base knowledge of game design, then this bootcamp is for you.

All sessions will take place at the University of Saskatchewan Campus in the Computer Science building (Thorvaldson building).

Sessions will run from 5:30 pm - 8:30pm.

Demo Day

You will have the opportunity to invite your family and friends to attend a final demo day on Wednesday, April 17, 2019 where you will have the opportunity to demo your own game and also test out fellow students final projects.

After the application deadline you will be notified if you have been accepted into the program. All sessions will be facilitated by individuals from the University of Saskatchewan Computer Science Program.
